African Affairs publishes articles on recent political, social and economic developments in sub-Saharan countries.

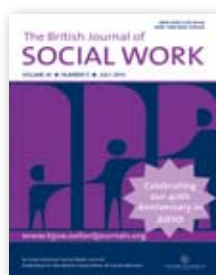

Parliamentary Affairs

Published since 1947, 4 issues per year, and included in the 2009 ISI Journals Social Science Citation Index with an Impact Factor of 0.565.

Parliamentary Affairs is an established, peer-reviewed academic quarterly covering all the aspects of government and politics directly or indirectly connected with Parliament and parliamentary systems in Britain and throughout the world. The journal is published in partnership with the Hansard Society. The Society was created to promote parliamentary democracy throughout the world, a theme which is reflected in the pages of *Parliamentary Affairs*.



The British Journal of Social Work

Published since 1971, 8 issues per year, and included in the 2009 ISI Journals Social Science Citation Index with an Impact Factor of 1.139.

The Review of Economic Studies

Published since 1933, 4 issues per year, and included in the 2009 ISI Journals Social Science Citation Index with an Impact Factor of 2.904.

Founded in 1933 by a group of young British and American economists, *The Review of Economic Studies* encourages research in theoretical and applied economics, especially by young economists. Today it is widely recognized as one of the core top five economics journals. *The Review* is essential reading for economists and has a reputation for publishing path-breaking papers in theoretical and applied economics.
