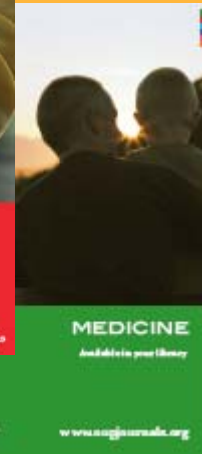

## What are RSS Feeds?

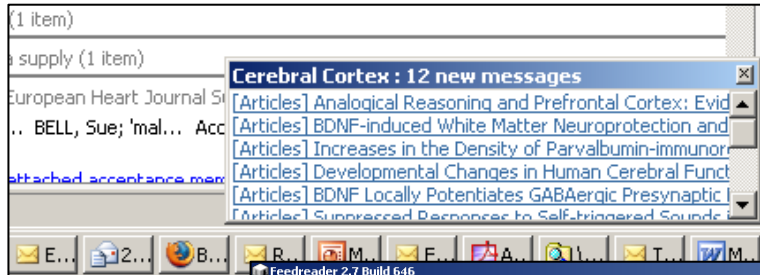
- RSS (“Really Simple Syndication”) is an established technology for providing up-to-date newsfeeds from web sites to end users.
- To receive RSS feeds you will need a web or desktop based ‘feed reader’ to regularly check for and download new content. A variety of these can be downloaded from the Internet.
- Each journal offers an RSS feed of the latest Table of Contents, providing RSS users with a convenient alternative to e-mail alerts.

Two feeds are available:

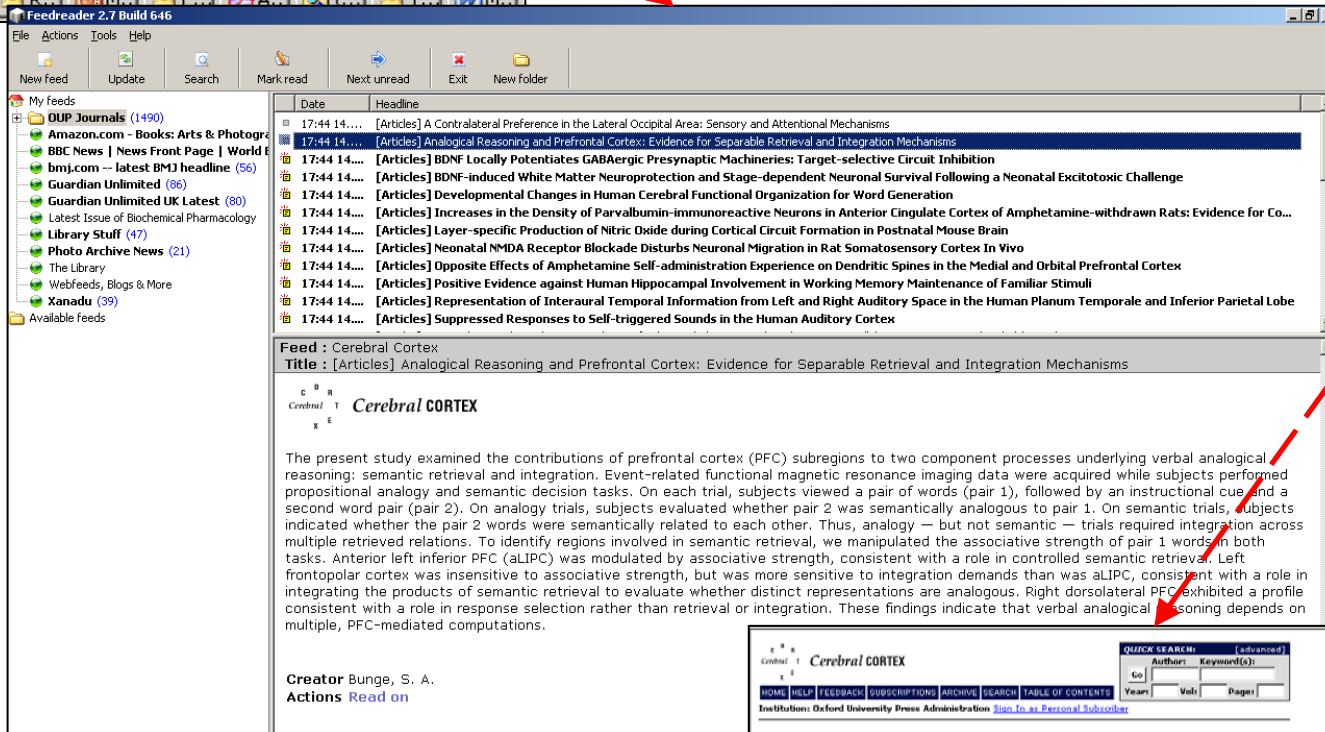
- RSS feed of current issue

Arginine vasopressin plays an important role in volume homeostasis. Patients with heart failure have chronically elevated plasma vasopressin concentrations which may contribute to their clinical syndrome of fluid retention. Recently, a number of agents have been developed to antagonize the effects of vasopressin by targeting its V<sub>1a</sub> and V<sub>2</sub> receptors, which are involved in vascular tone and free water regulation, respectively. Two vasopressin antagonists, in particular, tolvaptan and conivaptan, have shown promise in animal studies and small-scale human trials. The following is a review of current experimental and clinical studies using vasopressin antagonists and their potential role in the treatment of heart failure.
