Pre-print: an unrefereed manuscript version of the article, as submitted for review by a journal:

Following acceptance of your article you are entitled to mount the **pre-print** version of the article on your own personal website and/or that of your employer and/or post it on free public servers of preprints and/or articles in your subject area, as long as you acknowledge that the article has been accepted for publication by the relevant journal. Post-print: the final draft author manuscript, as accepted for publication by a journal, including modifications based on referees' suggestions but before it has undergone copy-editing and proof correction.
